Nurse Aide Competency Program

Nurse Aide Component Requirements: Students in the Health Occupations program have the opportunity to participate in the Nurse Aide Competency Evaluation program (NACEP). This program is a 126-hour program that includes theory, laboratory skills, and clinical

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in a long-term care facility. Theory and laboratory and clinical hours are held within the normal school year. In order for the student to participate in this program the following must be met:

- *Complete Level One Health Occupations with a 70% or higher.*
- *Complete Level Two Health Occupations with a 75% or higher.*
- *80% of required tasks must be completed from Level One and Level Two.*
- *No debts.*
- *All paperwork for the NAT program must be completed prior to the assigned starting date.*
- *Applicants residing in the Commonwealth for the last two years will complete and submit a Pennsylvania State Police – Criminal*

History Record Information (CHRI) report before the first day of class. A resident of the Commonwealth for less than two full years, prior to the date of application must complete and submit a PA CHRI and an FBI report before the first day of class.

*An applicant's CHRI report must be in compliance. It may not contain prohibitive offenses as cited in Act 14.
A physical exam is required.*

The physical exam must include:

- *Evidence that the applicant is free of communicable disease.*
- *Documentation of a negative 2-step Mantoux that is dated within a year of starting class. If a Mantoux is documented as positive, a negative chest x-ray, less than 5 years old must be submitted.*
- *Must be able to perform the duties of the nurse aide. This includes full use of hands, ability to stand for extended periods, bend, pull, push and lift a minimum of 40 pounds without restriction.*
- *Possess basic reading, writing and math skills to perform the nurse aide role. Must have the ability to communicate orally with and nursing staff.*
- *Committed to the principle of providing abuse-free care to ensure quality of life for the resident.*
- *Must be motivated and responsible to attend every day of the Nurse Aide Program.*

Information will be sent home when the student meets the eligibility requirements to participate in the Nurse Aide Competency Program. The information will be given in the year prior to the junior or senior year.
